

Shave Excision or Curettage & Cauterisation - Wound Care Advice

- Once the local anaesthetic has worn off, you may find that there is mild pain or discomfort. This is usually relieved by taking paracetamol.
- If there is any bleeding press firmly on the wound using a clean cotton handkerchief or clean hand towel for 10 to 20 minutes. Do not remove the dressing. If the bleeding does not settle telephone our clinic.
- Keep the area dry for 48 hours and then remove the dressing. The wound should then be washed on a daily basis to keep it clean and to gently remove any loose scab or crust.
- Vaseline (use a new pot) can be applied to the wound twice a day to keep it moist and encourage good healing.
- The wound will take approximately one to three weeks to heal.
- If you develop increasing levels of pain within a few days of the operation, or the skin become very red, sore or discharges pus, it usually means you have a secondary infection. You will need to be reviewed as antibiotics may be required.
